The subject of a sentence is the person or thing doing the verb.


The object is the person or thing having the verb done to him/her/it.


subject	verb	object	
The girl	sees	the farmer	
The farmers	watch	the slaves	

In Latin, the subject goes in the nominative case, the object goes in the accusative case. The verb goes at the end.
